Subject: Choke mitigation tool

Dear Mr. Raakjaer,

Thank you very much for your letter on choke species issues.

Let me start by stressing that the Commission greatly appreciates the work, which the PELAC has put into the identification of the category three choke situations for pelagic stocks in collaboration with the North Western Waters Member States Group and the NWWAC. There are indeed a number of outstanding challenges to implementing the landing obligation. Our objective is to work with you further to find solutions on specific stocks on a case-by-case basis.

Against this background, it would be important for DG MARE to receive a list of possible concrete choke cases for the pelagic fisheries in 2019, a proposal from the stakeholders in the pelagic fisheries as to how such choke situations can be avoided for 2019 and a list of the technical and avoidance measures for improved selectivity that were already undertaken by the stakeholders and the Member States administrations for these particular choke cases. This would greatly facilitate our common work to find solutions.

I would like to reassure you that we are aware of the worries of the stakeholders as to final stage of implementing the landing obligation. Let me hence recall what the Commission said throughout the process of negotiating the reformed CFP: we understand that the landing obligation represents a big change as to how we manage fisheries in Europe so far. We need to work together to address the choke situations you identify so that we can make the landing obligation work for us all. At the same time, I would also like to reiterate that it is important to ensure that the landing obligation is effectively implemented at sea: there is increasing evidence that compliance with the landing obligation remains low and this can seriously damage the reputation of our fisheries. This is something that we all want to avoid.

I look forward to working with you further on this in 2018 and thank you again for the important work you and the PELAC have undertaken so far.
